Guide Dogs UK Inspire Year 8 & 9 Student

This week, we were delighted to welcome representatives from Guide Dogs UK to speak with our Year 8 and 9 students about the incredible work they do to support people living with sight loss. The session made even more special by the visit of a fully trained working guide dog and an ambassador dog, who quickly became the stars of the show! Students learned about the remarkable training journey each guide dog undertakes—an intensive process that costs an astonishing £77,000 from puppyhood to full qualification. Pat and Jenny, our guest speakers, talked students through this journey, from early socialisation to advanced mobility training.



A highlight for many was the chance for several lucky students to take part in training demonstrations, showcasing the dogs' exceptional skills and obedience.

We are especially grateful to Pat, who has been fully blind for 18 years, for bravely speaking to more than 200 of our students. Pat shared her personal experiences with warmth, honesty, and humor—telling staff afterwards that our pupils were “the politest students she has ever spoken to,” and had asked brilliant, thoughtful questions throughout. We extend a huge thank you to Pat, Jenny and the Guide Dogs team for providing such an inspiring and eye-opening session.

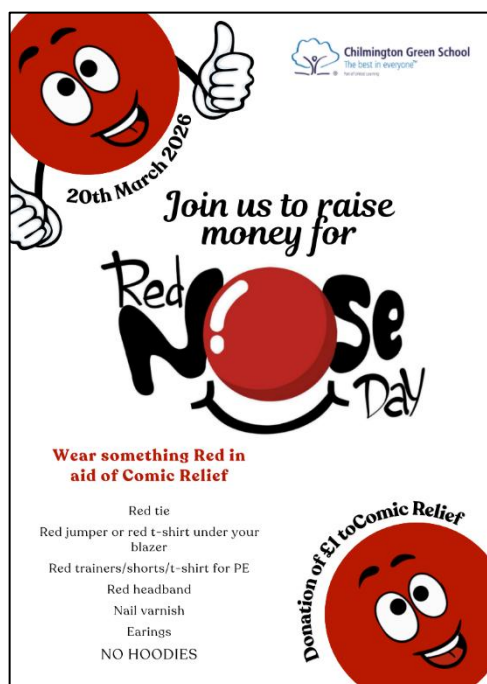
A huge congratulations to our winning teams:
