In your exam, you will be given the poem, so you do not need to remember quotes!

Go through the poems and pick 3 quotes that explore a key idea of either:

- 1. How does the poet present ideas about nature?
- 2. How does the poet present ideas about power?
- 3. How does the poet present ideas about freedom?

Then, analyse a quote and practise writing what/how/why paragraphs exploring the key idea.
