Update on Buildings

Kent County Council has now handed over our temporary home to us and it's almost ready for us to move in! All the rooms look fantastic and will provide the perfect environment for our students to begin their secondary education. We await a significant delivery of furniture and resources which will transform the newly refurbished building into a welcoming and inspiring place to learn.

Construction for our new building will get underway over the summer and we will keep you upto-date on progress as the building starts to take shape. There are currently significant groundworks taking place on site and, once complete, students and the wider community will begin to see the building emerge and take shape in the months ahead. We are awaiting a completion date from our contractor and will let you know as soon as this has been confirmed.

Language Preference

We are committed to ensuring that students' transition to secondary school is as seamless as possible. To support with this, students are given the opportunity to select the language they would prefer to study at Chilmington Green School. Students will likely wish to continue with the language they were studying at primary school although this is not essential as the curriculum has been designed to support students of all abilities, including those who have not studied a modern foreign language previously.

Your child should indicate a preference to study either Spanish or French. Students will study one language until the end of Year 9, after which students may select two languages to study at GCSE. Transition Day Reminder – Uniform and Equipment

Students should arrive for a 09:00 start and will be dismissed from the main school entrance at 14.30. Please ensure that travel arrangements have been made so that your child can safely travel to and from Wye School on the day. There will be an opportunity for parents/carers to purchase uniform from the pop-up shop at Wye School from 14:30 until 16:00.

For the transition days your child should wear their primary school uniform with shoes/trainers that will be suitable for outdoor activities. They will need to bring a bag containing drinks, a packed lunch, snacks and basic stationery (pen, pencil, ruler and rubber). Uniform Update and Reminder

The Chilmington Green School uniform reflects our high expectations and reinforces our school culture and values. We therefore expect students to adhere to our uniform expectations that can be found here. I would therefore like to highlight that shoes should be plain black leather or leather-look formal shoes.


Introducing the Chilmington Green School Community: Meet our Key Stage 3 Lead for English and Literacy Co-ordinator, Miss Fox

Our Extracurricular Programme

I have had various opportunities to work with young people over the years, including volunteering in holiday clubs, tutoring programmes, mentoring GCSE students and being part of the NCS programme. It was

made apparent to me within these various roles with young people that they delight more in education when they have inspired, passionate teachers who see the value in what they teach.



Through my volunteering roles prior to my first teaching role, I have seen the enormous value of student participation in activities outside of the classroom. I dedicate a lot of my time to supporting the wide range of extracurricular activities at Wye School such as Duke of Edinburgh, Combined Cadet Force and other various clubs. Classroom based learning is only part of our curriculum and I am excited by the prospect of working together with Wye School to bring a diverse range of extracurricular opportunities to the founding cohort at Chilmington Green School.

My Vision of the English Curriculum

Chilmington Green School will be mirroring the success of Wye School's curriculum which follows a diverse range of texts exploring different themes. The Year 7 theme is 'Conflict' and will start with a fantasy-adventure text called 'The Girl of Ink and Stars' which is a fun and imaginative way to start secondary school English.

Throughout their time in secondary school, students will explore a range of Shakespearian plays, poetry, non-fiction texts and 19th Century literature that covers a broad spectrum of themes. We have structured a writing curriculum that will complement the students' schemes of work and will allow them to be imaginative in creating their own writing.

Students will also participate in our Guided Reading Programme which has been designed to promote a life-long love of reading through enjoying a range of literature for pleasure rather than to study as part of the English curriculum. I have enjoyed many conversations with students at Wye School about the texts we are reading and am excited to inspire the same joy through my role at Chilmington Green School.
